



FIELD MARSHALL DUTIES

- Area:** The entire field that your team is playing on i.e. Bottom or Top. This includes all games within this area.
- Duration:** Arrive 30mins prior to the start of your game and finish at the completion of your game.
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You are required to report to the Club Official on duty at the clubhouse, collect your lanyard and vest and sign in on the game day register. You must record your team, name and mobile phone number.

Observe what games will be played on your field during your shift and the configuration the playing fields may be in. This information is posted on the draw board.

Introduce yourself to the medic on duty. Note: If the medic is not in attendance at the field you must stop games from starting.

Locate the Field Marshall on duty for the current game and assist them in managing the remainder of their game, whilst observing the next round of teams that are preparing for their games.

Ensure games finish on time, fields are reset and new games get under way on time.

Continue to act as field Marshall during your entire game.

The Field Marshall is to ensure that:

- All ropes are in position, goal post pads are fitted, a medic is in attendance and all Parents/spectators remain outside the roped/fenced area at all times including half time. This distance is 5m from the sideline.
- Only Trainers wearing a Trainer's vest may access the field. Trainers must be kneeling inside the enclosure unless attending to an injured player.
- All water bottle carriers, chairs, prams etc are kept outside the roped/fenced area as they can cause harm should a player be tackled out.
- Teams do not warm-up in the "in-goal" area during other games.
- **Team Managers co-locate (BJRU requirement).**
- Manager is wearing Team Official vest.
- Touch Judge is wearing Touch Judge vest.
- Unsportsmanlike conduct (e.g. abuse of Referee or players) is raised with the relevant Team Official and if the practice continues then escalate to the Club Official.
- Assist the medic with serious injuries by way of alerting the Club Official and keeping the area clear. Games are not to continue whilst an injured player is been treated on the field.

- Spectators are not permitted to cross or stand between the marked fields. Field Marshalls are permitted to cross between the mark fields but do not enter the playing area unless assisting with an injury

On completion of your game report back to the Club Official, return your lanyard and vest, note any comments in the game day register and sign out.

If you are the last game of the day ensure the teams have pulled the fields down completely, cones, ropes and pads are returned to the respective sheds and all rubbish is collected.
